
"J-T" & Libby

"J" is normally

extremely anxious and irritable in hospital, which results in a lack of compliance to any procedure the staff want to attempt. While Libby was present nursing staff were able to take "J"'s blood pressure, take his temperature and look in his eyes without a word of complaint.

I've never seen "J" do anything for the nurses without smart comments or an argument in the least, we were very surprised at how relaxed and calm he appeared.



Libby left and we said our goodbyes, it was lovely to have her there. It wasn't until 30 minutes after Libby left we really noticed the

impact of her presence. The nurse had come back in order to give "J" more pain medications and he flatly refused to take medications and his arguing began. Incredible to view for us just the huge impact that Libby brought to his anxiety and



frustration levels in such a difficult environment.
